Coming Alive in Christ ~ Our Journey to Easter



In Saint John's Gospel, the raising of Lazarus starts the chain of events leading to Jesus' death and resurrection. John uses the story to remind the early converts of the life-and-death consequences of choosing to follow Jesus. In today's Gospel we see the tension mounting between Jesus and his enemies.

Father of eternal life, you are a God, not of the dead, but of the living: you sent your Son to proclaim the good news of life, to rescue all from the kingdom of death and to lead them to resurrection. Free us from the power of the evil spirit who brings death. May we receive new life in Christ and bear witness to his resurrection.

Lord Jesus, by raising Lazarus from the dead you showed that you came that we might have life and have it more abundantly. By your life-giving sacraments, free us from the grasp of death and deliver us from the spirit of corruption. Through your Holy Spirit, who gives life, fill us with faith, hope, and charity, that we may live with you always in the glory of your resurrection, for you are Lord for ever and ever.

Ezekiel 37:12-14

The Lord said this: I am now going to open your graves; I mean to raise you from your graves, my people, and lead you back to the soil of Israel. And you will know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves and raise you from your graves, my people. And I shall put my Spirit in you, and you will live, and I shall resettle you on your own soil; and you will know that I, the Lord, have said and done this – it is the Lord God who speaks.

As I settle to pray, I ask the Lord to be open to his word today.

As Christians we do not escape the reality of our human nature, evil and suffering. The reality of death to sin is always with us. Through the Holy Spirit living in us, we are being continually called to share in God's unending love.

- How am I responding to this call to share in God's unending love this Lent?
- The Sacrament of Reconciliation is being offered to me this Lent. How am I responding to this offering of forgiveness and reconciliation?

John 11: 1-45 (extract)

'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' 'I am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?' 'Yes Lord,' she said 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into this world.'

I come to my place of prayer. I gently become aware of God's presence.

When I am ready, I slowly read and re-read the Gospel.

Jesus' promise of eternal life is a central element of our Catholic faith. Even though Easter is still two weeks away, our Gospel today invites us to acknowledge Jesus' power over death, evidenced in the raising of Lazarus, and to anticipate Jesus' conquering of death once and for all in his death and Resurrection.

We sometimes use examples from nature to help describe this mystery of our faith. Jesus himself talked about the seed that dies when planted in the ground in order to produce new life John 12:24. Using that image and others, we find hope and confidence in Jesus, the Resurrection and the life.

Jesus is the Resurrection and the life. As He Lazarus from the dead, so He gives us a share in His risen life now and will raise us up on the day of judgement.
