St Maximilian Kolbe ~ Pray For Us

This Friday we celebrate the feast of St Maximilian Kolbe, a Saint very much of our time. Born in Poland in 1894, Maximilian became a Franciscan friar. He believed that the world was passing through a time of intense spiritual crisis, and that Christians must fight for the world's salvation with all the means of modern communication. He founded a newspaper, a radio station and a sodality called the *Knights of Mary Immaculate*. During the 2nd World War, his monastery was a hiding place for 2,000 Jews. Then in 1941, Fr Maximilian was arrested by the Nazis for being a priest and sent to Auschwitz. One night, three prisoners escaped the camp and in retaliation, the guards began to select ten men who would be put in a bunker to starve to death. One man who was selected was a father and husband. Fr Kolbe volunteered to take his place and he led his fellow prisoners in worship and songs, as they suffered in the underground bunker. After two weeks without food and water, Fr Maximilian was killed by an injection of carbolic acid. The Prisoner, whose life Maximilian saved, was present at his canonization in 1982, when Saint Pope John Paul II named him a martyr of charity.
